

Between You and Me: Teacher's Song

A new play by Edward Thomasson with music by Soosan Lolavar, Between You And Me looks at how stories are told, modified and retold in order to process the events we experience around us. Developed with, and performed by, a group of non-professional actors from East London. The play is structured around a series of songs and explores how narratives can be constructed and performed as a way of transforming ourselves and each other.


Between You and Me was presented at The Glass House Community Centre in London on 6th July 2013. In *Teacher's Song*, the second song to feature in the work, the teacher tells the story of two prisoners who communicate by tapping on the wall that stands between them. The play was produced as part of Thomasson's residency at Chisenhale Gallery, funded by Create London.

Edward Thomasson (b. 1985, Stoke-on-Trent) works with video, performance and drawing. His narrative-based videos are developed with groups of trained and untrained performers and focus on the relationship between performance and everyday life, specifically looking at how the act of storytelling is used as a way to attempt to understand environments and exchange experiences. Thomasson also collaborates with Lucy Beech on performances that explore enactment in non-theatrical environments.

Soosan Lolavar (b. 1987, Greenwich) is a British-Iranian composer, sound artist and educator. Her work has been performed at the Royal Festival Hall, the National Maritime Museum, the ICA, the LSE New Academic Building, the Jacqueline Du Pré Music Centre, the Bonnie Bird Theatre and Circus Space. In 2013 she was selected as one of two Embedded composers in residence at the Southbank Centre and received funding from Arts Council England and Jerwood Charitable Foundation for an Iranian-British music project. She holds degrees in Social and Political Sciences (University of Cambridge) and Musicology (University of Oxford) and her research interests include the politics of gender and sexuality, post-colonialism and the music industry and postmodernism in electronic musics.
